Re: Armonia Indigenous Mexican Scholars Program

Dear Jonathan:

We are writing to give you an update on the tremendous success which our A.I.M.S. (Armonia Indigenous Mexican Scholars) program is enjoying, and to request that you share in this success by considering sponsorship of one or more students in the coming years.

As you are aware from your prior visit(s) to Mexico City and perhaps Oaxaca, Armonia has for several years identified and supported bright young students from the indigenous tribes in southern Mexico as they complete their high school studies and continue with university studies. You will recall that some of these students leave their families and villages at an early age (some as young as seven years old) to relocate to villages which have elementary and secondary schools. Our student residence was located for several years in Yalalag, but based on political unrest and other considerations, the student residence is now located in the City of Oaxaca.

Progress in the program has been most impressive. We have our first graduate, Joaquin, who received a degree in robotic and mechanical engineering, and is now pursuing post graduate studies while serving as a staff member at the student residence. We have several other students attending university in Mexico City, including Sergio who is pursuing further musical education at one of the most respected universities in Mexico, Avelino who is pursuing industrial engineering, and Blandina who is pursuing biochemistry. We currently have six students in Mexico City and twenty five students in Oaxaca. All students in Mexico City are pursuing university studies (or providing their year of service prior to commencement of the university program), and all the students in Oaxaca are either working towards completion of their high school studies or serving as big sisters and big brothers for the younger students.

Of particular note in connection with the A.I.M.S. program is the incredible news we just received that out of 25,000 applications for university admission, students in the A.I.M.S. program took six of the top 26 places. In other words, of the 25,000 applicants, A.I.M.S. students took the first, second, nineteenth, twenty first, twenty third and twenty sixth places. This is an incredible validation of the effectiveness of this program, including the instilling of a

sound high school education, exceptional study habits, and diligent preparation for university admission.

Not surprisingly, news of the A.I.M.S. program has spread, and we find ourselves in the wonderful position of having more applicants than can be accommodated in our facilities in Oaxaca. With nine of our students now finishing their studies in Oaxaca and heading to Mexico City to continue with university, Saul and Pilar are hopeful of admitting thirty (30) new students to the program this summer.

In order to make this commitment for new students, Armonia A.C. and its U.S. based support organization, Armonia U.S., need to insure that we have financial commitments for continuing support of these students for the next three years. The cost of supporting a student, either in Oaxaca or Mexico City, is approximately one hundred dollars (\$100) per month. Additionally, there is a start up expense per student of \$400, which attends to clothing, medical needs, school supplies, and shared access to a computer. The Boards of Armonia A.C. and Armonia U.S. have determined to seek multi-year support if possible to provide financial stability and assistance in planning for the future. Accordingly, support of a single student for a three year scholarship would be \$1,200 for three years, plus the initial \$400 or \$4,000 (\$1,600, \$1,200, \$1,200). Support of two students in the program for three years would be \$8,000 (\$3,200, \$2,400, \$2,400).

We are writing you to ask that you prayerfully consider committing to support one or more students for the coming three years. Your support could be provided on an annual or quarterly basis. For those with connections to Orangewood Presbyterian Church, your contributions could be made through that church and designated for the Armonia Ministry, student scholarships. For those involved with other churches, or who would prefer to give to another U.S. 501(c)(3) organization, Armonia U.S., Inc. would be pleased to receive your contributions.

For planning purposes, Saul and Pilar have asked that we attempt to finalize all commitments for student scholarships by August 1, 2009. This will allow for the proper planning and admission of the number of students which can be supported based upon commitments received. 
